

Front-End Loader Safety

✓ The "Dos" and "Don'ts" when working with or near front-end loaders.

✓ Demonstrate examples and proper safety guidelines to protect against hazards associated with front-end loaders.

Discussion Notes:

✓ Discuss the outcomes of the "Dos" and "Don'ts."

Do - Wear a seat belt at all times when operating a loader (regardless of the task being done).

- Raise and lower the loader arms slowly and steadily.
- Take extra precaution when handling loose loads.
- Keep the loader lowered when parking or servicing the machine.
- Relieve all hydraulic pressure before disconnecting hydraulic lines.
- Ensure all parked loaders are on a firm, level surface.
- Watch for overhead wires and obstacles when raising the loader.

Don't - Walk or work under a raised loader.

- Move or swing a load when people are in the work area.
- Travel with the load raised.
- Use the loader near the outer edge when working along high banks and slopes.
- Lift or carry people on the loader, bucket or attachments.
- Operate the loader from anyplace other than the driver's seat.
